In early January we appointed Nina Rawlins [below right], currently Forum Representative for the Northampton District, to be our Finance Officer for the next five years. Nina will shadow our current Finance Officer, Gillian Womersley, until 31st August before taking on her full role in September. Nina has been a member of the

Finance Task Group for a number of years and we're pleased to welcome her into this very responsible and at times challenging role on the Executive team.

Our Woman in Milan

The Methodist and Waldensian churches in Italy came together in the 70s. The surge in migration starting round about the mid 90s has brought with it the gift of many Christian migrant families, who have invigorated and rejuvenated the churches. They also brought with them—and have carried on to a certain extent—their ways of being church. The Methodist Waldensian Union has been on a journey of developing an intercultural approach to being church—

Essere Chiesa Insieme/Being Church Together. Daniel and I were invited in 2016 to serve alongside the church in this process.

Our family belongs to two congregations with people from the USA, UK, Ghana, China, Cameroon, Ivory Coast, Italy, Madagascar, Indonesia, Mexico, the Philippines, Sierra Leone, Nigeria, Germany, Vietnam...

So, what do I do?

I serve with the Intercultural National Committee which works alongside churches and their pastors offering support in various ways to encourage the development of the vision of *Being Church Together*. I also work with the Education Department (*Servizio Istruzione ed Educazione - SIE*), as an Intercultura Relationships facilitator and also as a member of the group of writers of Sunday School material (*La Scuola Domenicale*) for the use of the member churches of the Protestant Federation of Churches in Italy (*Federazione delle Chiesa Evangeliche in Italia -* FCEI). My main task here is to help develop an Intercultural approach in the preparation of the resources.

My family is going through an intercultural experience of its own. Not so long ago we were learning to speak French and Pidgin in Cameroon, and sampling the various regional delicacies of the student community of the Presbyterian Theological Seminary there. Today, our diet embraces a variety of Filipino, Italian, Indonesian and African dishes. What a wonderful thing it is to belong to the world wide family of God!
