Welcome and introduction

Welcome to this act of worship, in which we shall dedicate our Easter Offering and hear stories of how the World Mission Fund supports God's mission in different parts of the world. The stories are told by members of the World Church Relationships Team. Each one is about an NMA, a national in mission appointment. An NMA is someone who is working in their own country, appointed by our Partner Church in that nation but funded by the World Mission Fund of the Methodist Church in Britain. Each NMA is working in a difficult and challenging environment, but in Paul's words to the Philippians, "shines like a star" to bring the light of the risen Christ into that situation.

We light a candle as a symbol of the power of Christ's light to break down the barriers of darkness and bring hope into a needy world.

Risen Christ, into the darkness of homelessness and hopelessness,

All: Let your light shine.

We pray for the work of Jennifer Jag Jivan at the Christian Study Centre in Rawalpindi in Pakistan, thanking you for her passion to use dialogue to bring understanding. We pray that this work of peace-building among people of different faiths will bear fruit.

Risen Christ, into the darkness of division and conflict,

All: Let your light shine.
