



Sustainable Development Goal 1: To end poverty in all its forms everywhere by 2030



More than 700 million people, or 10 per cent of the world population, live in extreme poverty, living on less than \$1.90 per day, struggling to fulfil the most basic needs like health, education, and access to water and sanitation, to name a few.

It is predicted that the COVID-19 pandemic will push an estimated 71 million additional people into extreme poverty, more than half of them being women and children.

Pray: that God will teach us how to share what we have with those who have little;
that initiatives providing skills-training for income generation will prosper;
that each person will have the opportunity to realize their potential
and earn at least a living wage.
